<p><b>Contracts</b></p> <p>Any contract made between you as a councillor or your spouse or civil partner or the person with whom you as a councillor are living with as if they were spouses/civil partners (or a firm in which such person is a partner, or an incorporated body of which such person is a director* or a body that such person has a beneficial interest in the securities of*) and the council -</p> <p>(a) under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and</p> <p>(b) which has not been fully discharged.</p>	-	-
<p><b>Land and Property</b></p> <p>Any beneficial interest in land which is within the area of the council.</p> <p>‘Land’ excludes an easement, servitude, interest or right in or over land which does not give you as a councillor or your spouse or civil partner or the person with whom you as a councillor are living as if they were spouses / civil partners (alone or jointly with another) a right to occupy or to receive income.</p>	-	-
<p><b>Licences</b></p> <p>Any licence (alone or jointly with others) to occupy land in the area of the council for a month or longer.</p>	-	-

<p><b>Corporate tenancies</b> Any tenancy where (to your knowledge as a councillor)-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) the landlord is the council, and</li> <li>(b) the tenant is a body that you, as a councillor, or your spouse or civil partner or the person with whom you as a councillor are living as if they were spouses / civil partners is a partner of or a director* of or has a beneficial interest in the securities* of.</li> </ul>	-	-
<p><b>Securities</b> Any beneficial interest in securities* of a body where -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) that body to your knowledge as a councillor, has a place of business or land in the area of the council, and</li> <li>(b) either - <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) the total nominal value of the securities* exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body, or</li> <li>(ii) if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you as a councillor, or your spouse or civil partner or the person with whom you as a councillor are living as if they were spouses / civil partners have a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	-	-

*\*'director' includes a member of the committee of management of an industrial and provident society.*

*\*'securities' means shares, debentures, debenture stock, loan stock, bonds, units of a collective investment scheme within the meaning of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 and other securities of any description, other than money deposited with a building society.*
