Cannock Chase District was allocated £3,021,807 from the Government's UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF) to fund local projects for 3 years from 2022/2023 onwards.

The Fund aims to promote pride in our area and increase life chances across the UK investing in communities, supporting local business, and people and skills.



Cannock Construction Excellence Initiative

The UKSPF has contributed towards a community asset which will be delivered by South Staffordshire College in three phases.

Phase 1 > Building Community Capacity

Phase 2 > Supporting Local Business

Phase 3 > Providing people and skill courses

Phase 1 v

Boosting core skills and supporting adults to progress in work, by targeting those with no or low-level qualifications and skills in maths. Upskill the working population, reduce adult learning barriers and levels of inactivity.

Phase 2 v

This phase is focussed on supporting businesses in the Construction sector. It promotes local networking and collaboration that enables businesses and partners to share knowledge, expertise, and resources, and stimulate innovation and growth.

Phase 3 V

Collaborating with a range of local partners, such as HS2, Jobcentre Plus network and Cannock Chase Council, South Staffordshire College use specific local market intelligence data to ensure we meet the needs of both current and future employment needs while also considering the provision already available locally.

Poverty Benefits Advisor

Citizens Advice are working with Cannock Chase Council to provide 1-2-1 support and advice, to help claimants understand their benefit entitlements, provide advice to make eligible claims alongside supporting with appeal tribunals if needed. Residents may be unaware of the additional support available and this makes people more vulnerable to cost-of-living challenges.

The service is looking to help residents that aren't in work and those who are in low paid work. It will support residents who suffer with health conditions, younger people aged 18 and over, or in some cases aged 16-17 and pensioners.

Step up loans

Businesses across Cannock Chase are being encouraged to take advantage of an interest-free loan, designed to help them take the next step on their growth journey.

Did you know...

If you have a business which has been trading for 2-5 years and based in Cannock Chase you could be eligible for an interest- free loan of more than £3,000.



- No set-up fee
- No requirement for match-funding
- Repaid in full after 12 months with no repayments prior to this
- If the loan is not repaid in full after 12 months interest will be added
- Loans can be used for capital funding only

New life skills support for **Cannock Chase residents**

A new programme called Cannock Chase Discovery has been launched to help residents access tailored support to improve their general and life skills leading to better employment opportunities.

The programme offers a range of interventions across four broad categories: work, skills, health, and life. It is being delivered by Jobs 22 on behalf of Cannock Chase Council and funded by the Government's UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF).

Cannock Chase Discovery will help residents who are unemployed or employed and meet one of several criteria, including being from a low-income household, low skill levels, digital exclusion, and poor health.

The services will be delivered locally at the Jobs 22 office in Cannock and across several accessible community locations.

Grants for small to medium sized **businesses in Cannock Chase**

The West Midland Grant Programme is funded by the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

It is offering start up small-to-medium (SMEs) sized business grants from £1,000 to £7,500. Existing SMEs can get grants from £1,000 to £100,000 to support growth projects.

Applicants must demonstrate their projects will create new jobs. Grant awards will be limited to a maximum of 50% of the total project costs, with businesses expected to 'match-fund' whatever grant amount they receive.

Did you know...

For every £10,000 grant awarded, one new full-time job needs to be created within 6 months of grant award.







Economy Performance in Cannock Chase



19.5% people working from home in 2021 The national average was 31.5% This indicates that many people in the district are employed in jobs in which home working is not feasible.



61% of people aged 16+ in employment worked full-time for 31-48 hours per week in 2021 - above the England average of 59.1%

Full-time employment is more popular than part-time working in the district.

59.3% of people aged 16+ were economically active in employment in 2021 - above the national average of 57.4%



34.3% of people living in Cannock Chase aged 16+ in employment travelled less than 10km to work in 2021.



However, **23.8%** travelled between 10km to less than 30km - nearly double the national average of

14.4%

In Census 2021 Cannock Chase recorded:



64% of people travelled to work by driving a car or van

Damp and mould in private homes

Everyone has the right to a warm, secure, and decent home, yet many people in England are living in a home with damp and mould which may put their physical and mental health at risk.

Certain individuals may be at increased risk of the health impacts of damp and mould exposure. This could be due to health-related or age-related vulnerabilities, or because they are less able to report and act on quidance related to damp and mould, or simply because they are more likely to live in a home with damp and mould. Did you know...

This project will be focused on Cannock Chase Council four wards, which have been identified as having a high level £110,000 from Staffordshire of need, these are Cannock North, County Council to reduce Cannock East, Rawnsley and Western Springs which combined have a populati 25,900 residents, or 26% of the District.

The Council's Private Sector Housing team currently respond to complaints about damp and mould in the private sector. This funding will enable them to address these issues, focussing on vulnerable households, particularly those with children under the age of 5 years old and occupants over the age of 75 years, though other homes will also be considered.

The project will identify those living with damp, mould and excess cold within the private rented sector and work with Landlords to address these hazards. We will encourage private tenants and homeowners to come forward with any concerns they may have. We will strengthen our links and work with partner agencies to increase

awareness of the issues they may

come across to enable signposting and referrals to the Private Sector Housing Team and agencies that can assist with energy efficiency measures whilst at the same time working with Landlords to address the hazards.



occupation within the UK has increased significantly in recent years. Research demonstrates a link between housing

The number of houses in multiple

and mental health, substance/drug/alcohol abuse and that tenants of houses in multiple occupation (HMOs) are at greater risk of suffering from these complex conditions.

The Council's Environmental Health Service inspects HMO accommodation and responds to complaints and this new funding will allow the Team to proactively explore the links between mental health and the occupants of local housing, focusing in particular on those in HMO accommodation. This will enable us to promote awareness amongst landlords of the links between poor housing and mental health, substance / drug and alcohol abuse and to provide information, advice and assistance to both tenants and landlords to improve awareness and early help for those affected.

Did you know...

Cannock Chase Council has been awarded £110,000 from Staffordshire County Council to reduce health inequalities across the District.

Owners of licensed HMO accommodation have been contacted and a request made for any practical recommendations / good practice to share amongst others. They have also been invited to attend free training to provide the tools they need to support tenants.

Cannock Chase Heritage Trail

has been brought to life through the power of creativity!

The Cannock Chase Heritage Trail has been brought to life using animation and audio with the launch of two new digital trails - Chase Tales and Hear Our Heritage.



The Cannock Chase Heritage Trail is a 10-mile route linking the towns of Cannock, Hednesford and Rugeley. It passes through, or close to sites of historic or environmental interest, with interpretation panels along the way that tell the story of each location.

The new digital offer was unveiled recently at an official launch event which showcased the creation of the two digital trails along with a new trail leaflet and map.

The Chase Tales Trail is suitable for families and brings to life the interpretation panels with the use of musical animations.



Content has been created by local schoolchildren alongside professional artists and the Birmingham Rep Theatre.

The Hear Our Heritage Trail is suitable for families and history enthusiasts who would prefer to listen to the interpretation panels rather than read them. An audio piece has been created for each and allows people to listen to the history whilst they walk along the trail.

The audios have been created by members of Tower Players.

Visitors can take on the new trails via the Cannock Chase Can App where they will need to collect all the QR codes for each themed trail to complete a challenge and gain points and rewards for their efforts.
